

## Houston Kashruth Association : Kosher Guidelines Manual

This manual serves as an addendum to all client contracts and is a reflection of HKA policies.

It must be stated once again that all ingredients and food products must be pre approved by an HKA rabbinic Supervisor and the fact that the guidelines may declare that the item is acceptable does not supersede the need for rabbinic approval.

### VEGETABLES

1. **Artichokes** - Fresh, frozen and canned artichokes are not to be used without reliable *hashgacha* with the exception of artichoke bottoms. All artichoke bottoms are permissible when packed in water, with exception of canned product from China.
2. **Asparagus – Green – Fresh** must have the tips cut off. Canned & frozen only with a reliable *Hashgacha*.
3. **Asparagus – White-** All are permissible without further checking after rinsing with water. Canned & frozen only with a reliable *Hashgacha*.
4. **Barley - (Raw Dry)** - Barley may become infested at the food warehouse or retail store or even in ones own home due to prevailing conditions such as humidity, temperature and other insect infestation. As such, one should always make a cursory inspection of the barley before purchasing (if possible) and before use, the barley should be placed in a bowl of cold water for a short time to remove any possible insects.
5. **Beans(Canned)** - Requires a reliable *hashgacha*.
6. **Beans (Green Beans and String Beans)** Fresh - A general inspection is needed to rule out obvious infestation.All frozen are acceptable. Canned require a reliable *hashgacha*.
7. **Beans (Raw Dry)-** Dried do not require kosher supervision unless flavorings are added.
8. **Beans,(Canned) All varieties of canned beans require acceptable kosher supervision.**
9. **Bean Sprouts** - A general inspection is needed to rule out obvious infestation.
10. **Bok Choy** – Must be washed very well with either a vegetable wash or a food grade soap solution, and checked with a *chazaka*. (*see above*)
11. **Boston, Butter or Bib Lettuce – not pre washed** - Must be washed very well with either a vegetable wash or a food grade soap solution, and checked with a *chazaka*.(*see above*) Pre washed may be used without *hashgacha* only after checking each leaf of the product or washing again using the *chazaka* check (*see above*).
6. **Broccoli** – It is very impractical and close to impossible for the average consumer to properly check fresh or frozen broccoli. It is therefore highly recommended that only product with a reliable *hashgacha* be used. Broccoli stems (**no florets**) may be used without checking after rinsing with water.
7. **Broccoli Slaw - Pre washed** without *hashgacha* may be used. No further washing is required.
8. **Broccoli Sprouts** - A general inspection is needed to rule out obvious infestation.
9. **Brussel Sprouts** – Fresh may not be used. Frozen may be used only with a reliable *hashgacha*. Canned needs a reliable *hashgacha*.
10. **Butter-** Must have acceptable kosher supervision.
11. **Cabbage Green**– Remove outer leaves, cut head into quarters, and wash well with water. Only spot checking is necessary.

- 12. Cabbage - Purple/Red - Not pre washed** - The leaves must be removed from the head and each leaf rinsed thoroughly under a stream of water.  
**Pre washed** and shredded may be used without *hashgacha*. No further washing is required.
- 13. Cabbage Slaw - Pre washed** without hashgacha may be used. No further washing is required.
- 14. Carrots** –All raw require a general inspection to rule out obvious infestation. All plain frozen carrots are acceptable. Canned would need a *hashgacha*.
- 15. Cauliflower** - Frozen cauliflower with a reliable hashgacha may be used without any further checking. Canned or jarred requires a reliable *hashgacha*. The washing and cleaning procedure for fresh and frozen cauliflower without a reliable hashgacha is as follows:
1. Remove green leaves from head.
  2. Cut head into 8 pieces.
  3. Prepare bowl of water mixed with vegetable wash.
  4. Place (cut) cauliflower into bowl of water, and agitate for 30 seconds.
  5. Remove cauliflower from water. If possible, check water to see if it contains any bugs.
  6. Pull off three full florets from the cauliflower's core.
  7. Check all surfaces of the thick and thin stalks in those florets, by gently separating the thin stalks from one another (without breaking them off of the floret) and visually inspecting the stalks.
  8. If no bugs are found in the above steps, the entire head may be eaten. If bugs are found, repeat the above steps.
  9. For cauliflower which is cut and washed at the company (frozen or fresh-packed), begin with Step #6.
- 16. Celery Stalks** – Must be washed and checked well, especially around the bottom of the stalk and around the leaves.
- 17. Cilantro** - Must be washed very well in either a vegetable wash or a food grade soap solution, and checked with a *chazaka*. (see above)
- 18. Cocoa**- Pure or with alkali do not require kosher supervision
- 19. Coffee** - Pure ground caffeinated or decaf do not require kosher supervision. Flavored coffees require acceptable kosher supervision.
- 20. Coffee Whitener**- Must have acceptable kosher supervision. For a meat meal it must be pareve.
- 21. Condiments**- All require kosher supervision
- 22. Corn** – On the cob - A general inspection is needed to rule out obvious infestation. All frozen is acceptable. Canned would need a *hashgacha*.
- 23. Cucumbers** - A general inspection is needed to rule out obvious infestation. Canned requires a reliable *hashgacha*.

24. **Dairy products**- All dairy products other than milk require acceptable kosher supervision.
25. **Dill** – Must be washed very well in either a vegetable wash or a food grade soap solution, and checked with a *chazaka*. (see above)
26. **Dough**- Frozen all frozen bread dough must be pareve and with acceptable kosher supervision. Sweets may be dairy. This will include (but not be limited to) the following: bread, challah, cookie, fillo, puff pastry and rolls.
27. **Eggs** - All chicken eggs are kosher. The mashgiach must check for blood spots
28. **Endive** - Must be washed very well in either a vegetable wash or a food grade soap solution, and checked with a *chazaka*. (see above)
29. **Fish (canned)** - Must have acceptable kosher supervision
30. **Fish (fresh)**- Whole, skin and scales must be left on an area at least 2" x 2", except for salmon and steelhead trout, which may be purchased filleted (with or without skin)
31. **Fish(frozen)** - Must be purchased with acceptable kosher supervision with skin on, except for salmon and steelhead trout.
32. **Flavored flours** - Require kosher supervision.
33. **Flour** - All varieties Flour with vitamins are acceptable without kosher supervision.
34. **Flowers** – Must be spot checked for bugs. If bugs are found, the batch should not be used.
35. **Fruit, canned**- In water its own juice or sugar and not produced in China, are acceptable with kosher supervision. Lite fruit as well as fruit cocktail generally have additional ingredients (color, flavorings, grape juice) and require supervision.
36. **Fruit, Dried** -The following dried fruits require kosher supervision: apples  
bananas blackberries blueberries cherries cranberries figs mangoes papaya pears rasp  
berries strawberries
37. **Fruit, Frozen**- w/o additives, except sugar or Nutrasweet, are acceptable without supervision
38. **Fruit Juices** - Bottled or canned require kosher supervision.
39. **Fruit Juices: Frozen** - Orange, lemon, apple and grapefruit juice, without additional ingredients, is acceptable without kosher supervision.
40. **Fruit Jams** -Spreads require kosher supervision.
41. **Garlic Cloves** - A general inspection is needed to rule out obvious infestation.
42. **Grains (Raw Dry)** - Grains processed in the United States and most other countries are centrifuged to remove bugs. As long as the grains are stored in cool and dry conditions they will remain bug-free for many months. For this reason, there is no need to check grains for insect infestation in the United States. Grains in another country or if you have reason to believe the beans may not have been stored properly may require further inspection for insects.
43. **Green Onions** - Cut along length of green onion "leaf" and check for bugs inside and around the area protruding from the bulb. Discard the roots.
44. **Herbs** - Must be washed very well in either a vegetable wash or a food grade soap solution, and checked with a *chazaka*. (see above)
45. **Honey** - Unflavored does not require kosher supervision
46. **Iceberg Lettuce:**  
Not pre washed – Outer leaves must be removed and the head should be quartered. Rinse the whole quarter piece with running water and a cursory inspection is needed. If insects are found after rinsing, each leaf must be checked. If the infestation is severe, the lettuce should be discarded.  
Pre washed without hashgacha may be used. No further washing is required.
47. **Leek** - Cut along length of leek "leaf" and check for bugs inside and around the area protruding from the bulb. Discard the roots.
48. **Lettuce – all other than iceberg:**  
**Not pre washed** - Must be washed very well with either a vegetable wash or a food grade soap solution, and checked with a *chazaka*. (see above)  
**Pre washed** may be used without *hashgacha* only after checking each leaf of the product or washing again using the *chazaka* check (see above).
49. **Margarine**- Must have acceptable kosher supervision. Only pareve margarine is acceptable in the meat kitchen.

50. **Meat**- All meats must be glatt, soaked and salted. Raw liver is not acceptable.
51. **Meat Substitutes**- Must have acceptable kosher supervision.
52. **Mint** - Must be washed very well in either a vegetable wash or a food grade soap solution, and checked with a *chazaka*. (see above)
53. **Mushrooms** – Fresh mushrooms must be rinsed and a cursory inspection is needed. Portabella mushrooms should have the brown under part removed. All frozen mushrooms are acceptable. Canned mushrooms must have a reliable *hashgacha*.
54. **Okra** - Fresh - A general inspection is needed to rule out obvious infestation. Any frozen may be used, Canned must have a *hashgacha*.
55. **Oils**- All processed oils require kosher supervision, except for cold-pressed extra virgin olive oil. Olives, black, canned or jarred when made in US and packed in water, salt and/or ferrous sulfate, are acceptable without certification. Other olives require kosher supervision.
56. **Onions** – The outer peel should be removed. Frozen and fresh cut onions must have a reliable *hashgacha*. Frozen and fresh pearl onions are acceptable without *hashgacha*. Canned would need a reliable *hashgacha*.
57. **Parsley** - Must be washed very well in either a vegetable wash or a food grade soap solution, and checked with a *chazaka* (see above) .
58. **Peas & Pea Pods** – Fresh - A general inspection is needed to rule out obvious infestation. Any frozen may be used. Canned must have a *hashgacha*.
59. **Pea Sprouts** - A general inspection is needed to rule out obvious infestation.
60. **Peppers** – Both hot and sweet may be used after a general inspection to rule out obvious infestation. Canned would need a reliable *hashgacha*.
61. **Poultry**-All poultry must be certified as kosher, and certified by the OU, COR or MK.
62. **Rice (Raw Dry)** - All varieties do not require kosher supervision, unless flavorings are added.
63. **Romaine Lettuce: Not pre washed** - Must be washed very well with either a vegetable wash or a food grade soap solution, and checked with a *chazaka*. (see above)  
*Pre washed* may be used without *hashgacha* only after checking each leaf of the product or washing again using the *chazaka* check (see above).
64. **Salad Dressings**- All varieties do not require kosher supervision, unless flavorings are added.
65. **Scallions (green onions)** – Cut along length of scallion and check for bugs inside scallion and around the area protruding from the bulb. Discard the roots.
66. **Shallots** – Peeled and washed - A general inspection is needed to rule out obvious infestation.
67. **Soup Bases**- Must have kosher supervision.
68. **Spices**- Pure dried Spices do not need kosher supervision. Spice blends do.
69. **Spices**- Fresh spices are kosher. However, there is a concern regarding insect infestation. They must be washed by the *mashgiach*.
70. **Spinach** – It is very impractical and close to impossible for the average consumer to properly check frozen spinach. Therefore, only product with a reliable *hashgacha* may be used. *Pre washed* may be used without *hashgacha* only after checking each leaf of the product or washing again using the *chazaka* check (see above). Canned needs a reliable *hashgacha*.
71. **Spring Mix:**  
*Not pre washed* - Must be washed very well with either a vegetable wash or a food grade soap solution, and checked with a *chazaka*. (see above)  
*Pre washed* may be used without *hashgacha* only after checking each leaf of the product or washing again using the *chazaka* check (see above).
72. **Squash** – A general inspection is needed to rule out obvious infestation. For Frozen, see "frozen vegetable" below.
73. **Tomatoes** - A general inspection is needed to rule out obvious infestation. All jarred and canned tomato products need a reliable *hashgacha*.
74. **Tomato products**- Canned All must have acceptable kosher supervision.
75. **Vegetables**- Canned or jarred All must have acceptable kosher supervision or be specifically approved prior to use by HKA.
76. **Vegetables**- Frozen do not require kosher supervision.
77. **Vinegar**- All forms must have acceptable kosher supervision.
78. **Zucchini** - A general inspection is needed to rule out obvious infestation. Any frozen maybe used.

## CANNED/JARRED VEGETABLE GUIDE

Most canned and jarred vegetables require a reliable hasgacha. There are some exceptions to the rule. Hearts of palm and artichoke bottoms under the supervision of the Peru Rabbinate are acceptable if only packed in water (no oil or vinegar). Artichoke hearts under the same hashgacha are not recommended. There may be other exceptions to the rule, but unless you know otherwise, all others would need a reliable hasgacha.

## FROZEN VEGETABLE GUIDE

All frozen vegetables are acceptable, with the following exceptions that would require a reliable hashgacha: Broccoli, Brussel Sprouts, Asparagus, Cut Onions, Spinach, Potatoes, Artichoke Hearts.

- Any vegetable containing added ingredients such as pasta, oil, spices, sauces, flavors, or colors;
- Any frozen vegetables that are packed in Israel require reliable hashgacha.
- Any vegetables that are canned in Israel or China require reliable hashgacha.
- Any Winter Squash (this is squash that must be cooked before eating) that is fully cooked (due to the requirements of Bishul Yisroel)

## FRUITS

**All freeze dried fruits require a reliable hashgacha. For a listing of the status of other dried fruits, click [HERE](#).**

1. **Blackberries** – Fresh are not recommended at this time. All frozen are acceptable. All canned needs a reliable *hashgacha*.
2. **Blueberries** – Fresh must be rinsed in water and a cursory inspection is needed. Frozen are acceptable. Canned needs a reliable *hashgacha*.
3. **Dates** - A general inspection is needed to rule out obvious infestation.
4. **Figs** - A general inspection is needed to rule out obvious infestation.
5. **Mulberries** - Fresh are not recommended at this time. All frozen are acceptable. All canned needs a reliable *hashgacha*.
6. **Raspberries** –Fresh are not recommended at this time. All frozen are acceptable. All canned needs a reliable *hashgacha*.
7. **Strawberries** – Fresh strawberries that are smooth and rounded in shape should have the tops cut off and the strawberries should be gently rubbed while rinsed well under a strong stream of water. Strawberries that have an unusual shape and are curved, causing some crevices and overlaps on the surface where small insects may hide, must have the tops removed and then also must be soaked for a short while in a kosher vegetable wash or a soap solution. They then must be rinsed off under a strong stream of water. All frozen without added flavors or colors are acceptable. All frozen strawberries packed only with sugar is acceptable. Canned strawberries require a reliable *hashgacha*.

## CANNED/JARRED & FROZEN FRUIT GUIDE

All canned, jarred and frozen fruit is acceptable unless they contain any natural and/or artificial flavors or natural colors, grape juice or the words "fruit juice", or are canned in Israel or China.

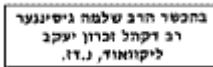

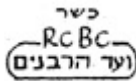
